## Checklist

Please make sure you have completed everything on this checklist before you leave home.

### Visa and Passport

To obtain your F-1 student visa, you must receive your I-20; pay the SEVIS I-901 fee; confirm that your passport will not expire within six months of your expected entry date to the US; and schedule a visa application interview at a US Embassy or Consulate. An overview of the visa application process can be found on page 4.

### Visit a Doctor

Complete both pages of the Health Form - page 1 is the physical examination and page 2 lists your vaccinations. Both pages need to be signed by a health care professional. Bring confirmation of the vaccinations (in English) from your doctor with you to orientation. See medical information on page 6.

### Book Travel

Find suggested airports and temporary accommodation information on page 8. Don't forget to submit your travel details through our arrivals portal so we may arrange airport transfer at: [www.INTOarrivals.com/drew](http://www.INTOarrivals.com/drew). Find more information on page 8. Plan to arrive on move-in day.

### Housing

Send in roommate preference form prior to your arrival.

### Photo

Submit photo for your student ID card prior to your arrival. Photo requirements: JPEG format, color (no black and white), solid, light colored background, and framing from top of the shoulders to the top of the head, looking straight forward.

### Secure Your Documents

In order to register for your classes, you will need to bring your official academic documents and test scores listed in your offer letter. # Getting Your Student Visa

As an international student, you are required to have a visa that permits study in the US. Below, we provide you with information about applying for an F-1 visa, which is a student visa and will allow you to study at a US university. You will need to schedule an appointment to apply for this visa at a US Embassy or Consulate in your country and complete a visa interview.

## Get additional support with PASS: Pre-Arrival Support Service

INTO Drew offers you PASS, a pre-arrival service which helps students have a better understanding of the visa application process. ## Steps to getting your F-1 Student Visa

Please ensure you follow the instructions from the US Department of State, the below is for general guidance.

### 1 Obtain the Form I-20 from the University

With your confirmation package, you should have received the form I-20. Carefully read the instructions included with the I-20 before visiting the US Embassy or Consulate for your F-1 student visa. Keep this document in a safe place because you will need to bring the original signed form for your visa interview.

### 2 Pay the SEVIS I-901 Fee

The I-901 fee is required to get the F-1 visa. At least three business days before you schedule your visa interview, pay the SEVIS I-901 fee by going to the SEVIS I-901 fee website at [www.fmjfee.com/i901fee/index.html](http://www.fmjfee.com/i901fee/index.html). You must follow the instructions to pay the SEVIS fee and print the receipt. This fee is not the same as the visa application fee. You will need your SEVIS ID number when you pay the fee. It can be found on the top right-hand side of your I-20. You will also need the university school code, below:  
Drew F-1 School code: **NEW214F00148000**

### 3 Complete the Online Nonimmigrant Visa Application, Form DS-160

After paying the SEVIS I-901 fee, you must complete the online visa application, form DS-160. When you have completed and have submitted the application, print the DS-160 bar code page and confirmation page. Please note you will need to upload a photo during this process, so ensure that you have one ready that meets requirements.

### 4 Schedule your Visa Appointment

## 5 Prepare for Your Interview

### Gather required documents

- Passport – ensure that your passport is valid for at least 6 months beyond your period of stay in the US (unless exempt by country-specific agreements).
- Form DS-160 confirmation page and bar code page
- Application Fee (I-901 fee) payment receipt
- Photo – bring a hard copy of the photo you used for your DS-160 application form.
- Form I-20 issued to you by Drew University
- Proof of funding documents that you used during your confirmation
- Additional documents: Please see additional documents that are required or recommended on the [Travel.State.Gov](http://Travel.State.Gov) website at the top of this page.
- Check with Embassy or Consulate where you will be applying to see if there are additional requirements.

### Schedule a PASS Welcome call

- While this is not required, it is strongly recommended to have this call prior to your visa interview. Please email [PASS@intoglobal.com](mailto:PASS@intoglobal.com) to set up a welcome call and get helpful support.

## Transferring From Another US School

If you are transferring from another school in the US and you already have an F-1 visa, you must complete the F-1 Student Transfer Eligibility form at least 15 days before the start date of your program.

If you plan to travel outside of the US before beginning your program at Drew, please contact Drew to obtain an I-20 for re-entry.

## Visa Delays

If you are unable to obtain a visa before the start date for which you have been admitted, email INTO Drew immediately. You may request a refund due to visa denial only, or you may defer and apply your deposit toward the tuition for the next semester.

# Medical Information

## Immunization Requirements

You will receive two Drew health forms (immunization record and physical examination), which must be completed in English and signed by a doctor before you arrive. Students living on campus who do not have the meningococcal vaccination by arrival must receive it within 24-hours of moving into the residence halls.

## Immunization Requirements

- Meningococcal: Required for all students. More information about this vaccine can be found on the Center of Disease Control website:  
[www.cdc.gov/meningococcal](http://www.cdc.gov/meningococcal)
- COVID-19 Vaccine: Complete WHO approved vaccination series plus Booster. Proof of vaccination is required as well. If unable to fulfill this requirement before arrival, it can be completed at a local pharmacy after arrival.

- Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR): Two doses required.
- Hepatitis B: Three doses required.
- Tuberculosis screening and testing: Students from countries identified as high risk for tuberculosis (TB) are required to complete a tuberculosis screening after arrival in the US.

You must bring proof that you have received these vaccinations or start the vaccinations during your first week of class. Drew's Health Services Department on campus will be able to offer on-site services to update students with immunizations, including MMR, meningococcal and other necessary vaccines.

## Student Health Insurance

Students with the student health insurance plan will not be charged for vaccines.

Drew University requires all international students to have health insurance. INTO Drew University student health insurance plan is automatically added to the invoices of all students to reduce high medical costs. Please note that most travel insurance policies will not meet the health insurance waiver requirements.

## Book Travel



### Book Your Flight

As an F-1 student, you are allowed to enter the US no earlier than 30 days before the program start date listed on your I-20. If you arrive after the start date listed on your I-20, you may be denied entry to the US. When booking your flights, remember that you should come to campus on your move-in date.

- Newark Liberty Airport (EWR) recommended
- John F Kennedy Airport (JFK)\*
- LaGuardia International Airport (LGA)\*

\*Additional fee will apply for JFK and LGA airport transfers.

### Let Us Know You Are Coming

Submit your arrival details online via [www.INTOarrivals.com/drew](http://www.INTOarrivals.com/drew) at least 14 days before arriving in the US so we can arrange a transfer service to greet you at the airport and take you to your local accommodations.

You will need to provide the following information:

- Application ID
- Personal contact details
- Flight number
- Arrival date and time
- Where you will be traveling to: the campus, a hotel or local apartment, etc.

Plan to arrive in Madison on the move-in date. If you arrive before move-in day, you will need to book your stay at a local hotel. You will be responsible for arranging and paying for your temporary accommodations. Some hotels recommend by Drew are:

## What to Pack

### Weather

New Jersey's climate has four seasons ranging from an average of 4°C in January to 30°C in July. You can expect some snow in the winter months and plenty of sun in the summer months. It is important to have clothes to accommodate the four different seasons. There are plenty of nearby places to purchase any additional items you may not have planned for.

### Clothing

Due to weather changes, you will need clothing for both warm and cold seasons. All of these items are available for purchase in Madison upon arrival, so only pack what you need for the first few months after you arrive.

### Room Essentials and Decorations

Consider bringing decorations for your room that will remind you of home such as photos, books, music, recipes and items associated with a hobby or sport you enjoy. Many students also choose to bring items of cultural significance such as their national dress. You will receive a welcome pack upon arrival with many small necessities including snacks, shampoo, mouth wash, toothbrush and more.

### What to Carry on the Plane

- Original I-20
- Valid passport and F-1 visa
- SEVIS I-901 fee payment receipt
- Evidence of funding for your tuition fees and living costs, including sponsor letter
- Health forms and immunization documentation
- All medical prescriptions written in English
- Official transcripts or test scores
- Insurance documents
- Laptop computer

### Appliances

US electrical outlets are 110 volts AC and use a NEMA electrical socket. You may need an adapter to use electronics from home. Appliances with exposed heating elements are prohibited in residence halls. Purchase appliances after you arrive.

### Cell Phones

When you arrive, you will be given a campus SIM card with instructions on how to activate your phone on a US plan. You will receive more information at orientation where we will walk you through the steps.

## Customs and Immigrations Tips

An immigration officer may ask you some questions. Be prepared to answer:

- Why are you coming to the US?
- Where and what course are you studying?
- Where will you live during your studies?
- How are you going to fund your studies?

Your I-94 arrival/departure form is now a paperless document. However, if you receive a paper copy, do not lose it. It costs more than \$300 to replace a paper I-94.

Please submit at least 14 days before arriving in the US so we can arrange a car service to greet you at the airport and take you to Drew. Plan to arrive in Madison on the move-in date. If you arrive before move-in day, you will need to book your stay in a local hotel.

# Housing and Dining

## Living On Campus

All Undergraduate Pathway and Academic English students are required to live on campus for the first two years of their education at Drew.

### Residence Halls Include:

## Information for Graduate Students

## Dining On Campus

Undergraduate students are required to participate in a meal plan. The INTO Drew meal plan allows students to use varied dining facilities across campus. The plan also includes dining dollars that can be used in locations around campus to purchase items that are not available in the dining hall. The meal plan consists of unlimited meals in the main dining hall with 150 dining dollars per semester. Graduate students who live on campus have a choice of having a meal plan or not. The plan allows 5 meals a week in the main dining hall and 100 Dining Dollars per semester to be used at other food service locations on campus.

## The Commons

Newly renovated, our dining hall offers all-you-can-eat buffets with plenty of options. You can enjoy home-style cooking, pizza, hamburgers, international foods, fresh fruit and desserts. The Commons offers different cooking stations featuring varying cuisines and dietary options including vegetarian, vegan, halal and gluten free.

## The Ehinger Center Food Court

Located in the student social hub of the university, the EC Food Court offers extensive, à la carte selections. Students can use their campus meal plan during lunch and dinner hours. Quick snacks, sandwiches, salads and locally baked goods can also be purchased here using dining dollars or cash. We also brew Starbucks coffee in the EC food court.

## A Quick Snack on the Go

Located at McLendon Hall, across from the first-year residence halls, the McLendon Deli offers a wide selection of snacks, beverages, health and beauty needs, microwavable foods and more. P.O.D. Market combines the corner store with the style of a modern market. It features grab 'n' go dining options for breakfast, lunch or any time of day, including: freshly prepared breakfast sandwiches; burritos, wraps, sushi and salads; as well as fresh produce, bakery and coffee selections; and traditional essentials found in a convenience store.



# Orientation

You should arrive in Madison on move-in day. Please speak with your educational counselor or refer to your confirmation for the specific campus move-in date. Upon completion of the international student orientation in the fall, you will attend Drew University's domestic orientation. You will be introduced to more Drew students and take part in activities that promote friendly interaction and even head to New York City as a class to get familiar with the city.

## At Orientation, You Will:

- Receive your complete class schedule
- Take an English language and math placement test (specific Pathway or select)
- Activate university email account
- Confirm you have provided all required health and admissions documents
- Pay any balances owed
- Take a campus tour
- Get your Drew University ID card.  
Don't forget to submit your photo early
- Attend fun activities designed to help you meet other students
- Open a checking and/or savings account with popular US banks
- Receive a campus Sim card for your cell phone with instructions for easy activation
- Visit local department stores for anything you may have forgotten or did not know you needed

## Math Placement Test

Students will need to take the math placement exam if they will be taking Calculus I (MATH 150). All students enrolled in the Pre-Engineering, Natural Sciences or Biomedical Sciences Pathways must take the exam. The exam will be taken during orientation to determine your math level and register to the correct math course.

## New Jersey Safety

Drew University is a very safe and welcoming campus that has its own dedicated Department of Public Safety providing 24-hour service to the student community. # Money and Banking

## Cash

When you arrive in the US, you should bring cash to cover immediate needs, and other small living and entertainment expenses. Cash is accepted at most locations.

- One dollar (\$) is equal to 100 cents.
- Common coin amounts: quarter (25 cents), dime (10 cents), nickel (5 cents), penny (1 cent)
- Common paper bill amounts: \$100, \$50, \$20, \$10, \$5, \$1

## Credit/Debit Cards

In the US, the most widely accepted bank and credit cards are Visa and MasterCard. Bank cards can either be debit which pulls funds from your bank account or credit, which you pay off at the end of each month. Apply for a credit card in your home country before you travel since it may be difficult for you to get one after you leave.

## Bank Accounts

It is not recommended to carry large amounts of cash with you. Once you arrive, open a bank account. To open an account, you will need two pieces of photo identification (passport and student ID card), your US mailing address and money to deposit.

Recommended banks and credit unions near campus include Bank of America and Chase Bank which are both a five-minute walk from campus. Representatives from a variety of banks visit campus during the Fall and Spring orientations to answer any questions.

## Transferring Money

Before you leave your country, you need to know your government's regulations and your home bank's procedures for transferring money to the US. Plan to transfer enough money to cover your expenses for one semester. Consider your living situation and lifestyle to plan ahead. Do you like to eat at restaurants? Do you need to buy clothes or more school supplies?

# Transportation

## Getting Around Campus

Drew's campus is 186 acres and every corner is easily reachable by walking. From one end of campus to the other would take an average speed walker about 10 minutes or less. Dorms are conveniently located near academic buildings. Students are not permitted cars on campus.

## Drew Bike Rental Program

As part of the greater goal for a sustainable campus, Drew encourages bicycling as a form of alternative transportation. Drew's size and terrain make it great for biking.

## New Jersey Transit

Just four blocks from the end of campus, the Madison train station is a short walk from campus and grants you access to nearby Morristown and other New Jersey destinations as well as New York City in just 50 minutes. Tickets can be purchased at the train station from electronic kiosk or ticket booth during operating hours.

## Other Transportation

NYC subway offers service 24 hours per day and every day of the year. With 469 subway stops serving 24 lines, the NYC subway system is the largest rapid transit system in the world.
