Please make sure you have completed everything on this checklist before you leave home.

☐ Visa and passport To obtain your f-1 student visa, you must receive your i-20; pay the SEVIS I-901 fee; confirm that your passport will not expire within six months of your expected entry date to the US; and schedule a visa application interview at a US embassy or consulate. An overview of the visa application process can be found on page 4. ☐ Visit a doctor You must show proof of being vaccinated for measles, mumps and rubella, tetanus and pages 6 and 7. Your doctor must sign the immunization record form and if you are under

diphtheria, tuberculosis, hepatitis b and meningococcal. Bring your original records with you to the US, along will all completed forms and documents. ☐ Book travel Find suggested airports and temporary accommodation information on page 8.

☐ Find housing Review your options for on-campus and off-campus housing on page 12 and secure housing arrangements prior to arriving in the US.

In order to register for your classes, you will need to bring your official academic documents and test scores. Review a full list of what you will need to bring on page 9.

☐ Travel and arrival details Send us your travel itinerary and flight arrival details so we can schedule airport transfer from the

airport to your accommodation. Confirm your travel details at www.Intoarrivals.com/Mason. Find more information on pages 10 and 11.

Getting your student visa

As an international student, you are required to have a visa that permits study in the US. Below, we provide you with information about applying for an F-1 visa, which is a student visa and will allow you to study at a US university. You will need to schedule an appointment to apply for this visa at a US Embassy or Consulate in your country and complete a visa interview.

Get additional support with PASS: pre-arrival support service

INTO George Mason University offers you PASS, a pre-arrival service which helps students have a better understanding of the visa application process. Take advantage of this free service and connect with a PASS Specialist by emailing PASS@intoglobal.com to set up a welcome call and get helpful support.

Steps to getting your F-1 Student Visa

Please ensure you follow the instructions from the US Department of State, the below is for general guidance.

1. Obtain the form I-20 from the university

I-20s are currently being sent electronically to your email. Carefully read the instructions included with the I-20 before visiting the US Embassy or Consulate for your F-1 student visa interview. Keep this document in a safe place because you will need to bring the original signed form for your visa interview. For questions, reach out to oipsinto@gmu.edu.

2. Pay the SEVIS I-901 fee

The I-901 fee is required to get the F-1 visa. At least three business days before you schedule your visa interview, pay the SEVIS I-901 fee by going to the SEVIS I-901 fee website at

www.fmjfee.com/i901fee/index.html. You must follow the instructions to pay the SEVIS

fee and print the receipt. This fee is not the same as the visa application fee. You will need your SEVIS ID number when you pay the fee. It can be found on the top right-hand side of your I-20. You will also need the university school code, which is below:

 Mason F-1 school code: WAS214F00683000

3. Complete the online nonimmigrant visa application, Form DS-160

After paying the SEVIS I-901 fee, you must complete the online visa application, form DS-160. When you have completed and have submitted the application, print the DS-160 bar code page and confirmation page. Please note you will need to upload a photo during this process, so ensure that you have one ready that meets requirements.

4. Schedule your visa appointment

To schedule your appointment, go to the US Embassy and Consulate webpage: www.usembassy.gov. Find the location where you want to have an appointment, and follow the specific instructions for scheduling.

5. Prepare for your interview

Gather required documents

- Passport ensure that your passport is valid for at least 6 months beyond your period of stay in the US (unless exempt by country-specific agreements).
- Form DS-160 Confirmation page and bar code page
- · Application Fee (I-901 fee) payment receipt
- Photo bring a hard copy of the photo you used for your DS-160 application form.
- Form I-20 issued to you by George Mason University
- Proof of funding documents that you used during your confirmation
- Additional documents: Please see additional documents that are required or recommended on the travel.state.gov

website at the top of this page.

 Check with Embassy or Consulate where you will be applying to see if there are additional requirements.

Schedule a PASS welcome call

 While this is not required, it is strongly recommended to have this call prior to your visa interview. Please email PASS@ intoglobal.com to set up a welcome call and get helpful support.

Transferring from another US school

If you are transferring from another school in the US and you already have an F-1 visa you must complete the F-1 Student Transfer Eligibility form at least 15 days before the start date of your program. If you plan to travel outside of the US before starting your program at George Mason, please contact us to obtain an I-20 for re-entry.

Visa delays

If you are unable to obtain a visa before the start date for which you have been admitted, contact INTO Mason immediately. You may defer and apply your deposit toward the tuition for the next semester.

Vi Medical information

Immunization record form

Visit shs.gmu.edu for step-by-step instructions on how to complete the Immunization Record Form. You may visit https://shs.gmu.edu/about/forms/ to obtain a copy of the most up to date Immunization Record Form. This form must be completed in English and signed by a doctor before you arrive on campus. You may receive required vaccinations from your local doctor or hospital before you leave your country. If you do not have proof of immunizations when you arrive on campus, we will schedule an appointment for you at Student Health Services. All required vaccinations are free of charge if you are enrolled in the universityselected health insurance plan.



Immunization requirements

- Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) Two doses of the MMR vaccine or Titer (blood test) report indicating positive immunity
- Tetanus and Diphtheria Pertussis (Tdap) received within the last 10 years
- Tuberculosis (TB) Screening questionnaire listed on the Immunization Record form must be completed and submitted
- Hepatitis B Three doses of Hepatitis
 B or Twinrix, or Titer (blood test) report
 indicating positive immunity or a
 signed waiver
- Meningococcal Must receive vaccine between the ages of 16-21 or a signed waiver

Submit your completed Immunization Record form on the first day of Orientation or email it to intoadmissions@gmu.edu

You can also find the Immunization Record form online at shs.gmu.edu/immunizations/

If you are under the age of 18, your parent or guardian must also sign your Immunization Record form.

Health insurance

Students with F-1 and J-1 status are required to have George Mason University's UnitedHealthCare health insurance. If you have this visa status, you will automatically be enrolled in the university-selected health insurance plan managed by UnitedHealthCare. Health insurance fees are paid to INTO Mason and you can access your insurance card online during the first few weeks of classes.

If you already have health insurance and do not want to be enrolled in the universityselected health insurance plan, you must apply for an insurance waiver.

For health insurance waiver criteria including deadlines and instructions on how to submit a waiver, contact insure@gmu.edu or visit shs.gmu.edu/insurance/international

Only US health insurance plans will be considered for the waiver.

Please remember that any dependents traveling with you also will need to enroll in health insurance.

Prescriptions

Bring a copy of ALL prescriptions for medicines, eyeglasses and contact lenses with you to the US. The prescriptions must be in English.

Book travel



Book your flight

As an F-1 student, you are allowed to enter the US no earlier than 30 days before the program start date listed on your I-20. If you arrive after the start date listed on your I-20, you may be denied entry to the US.

When booking your flights, remember that you should arrive in Fairfax at least one day before your program start date. If you are living on campus you may check in to your residence hall as early as two days before Orientation begins. All students are expected to arrive at either Dulles International Airport (IAD) or Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport (DCA).

Submit arrival information

Submit your arrival details online at: www.INTOarrivals.com/Mason at least 72 hours before your flight arrives so we can arrange transfer service to greet you at the airport and take you to your accommodation.

You will need to provide the following information:

- Application ID
- Personal contact details
- · Flight number
- · Arrival date and time
- Where you will be traveling to: the campus, a hotel or local apartment, etc.

Weather

The Fairfax climate has four seasons with average temperatures ranging from 5° C in January to 32° C in July.

Clothing

Due to weather changes, you will need clothing for both warm and cold seasons. All of these items are available for purchase in Fairfax upon arrival, so only pack what you need for the first few months after you arrive.

Room essentials and decorations

Consider bringing decorations for your room that will remind you of home such as photos, books, music, recipes and items associated with a hobby or sport you enjoy. Many students also choose to bring items of cultural significance such as their national dress.

What to carry on the plane

- · Original I-20
- Valid passport and F-1 visa
- · SEVIS I-901 fee payment receipt
- Evidence of funding for your tuition fees and living costs, including sponsor letter
- · Health forms and immunization

documentation in English

- · All medical prescriptions written in English
- · Official transcripts or test scores
- · Laptop computer

Appliances

US electrical outlets are 110 volts AC and use a NEMA electrical socket. You may need an adapter to use electronics from home. Appliances with exposed heating elements are prohibited in residence halls. Purchase appliances after you arrive.

Cell phones

If you want a cell phone while living in the US, we recommend waiting to purchase the phone until you arrive in the US. You will receive more information at Orientation.

Luggage

Always label all of your luggage clearly. The label should have your full name and the address of the INTO Mason Center:

Entering the US

Be ready to present these documents at the US port of entry:

- · Original I-20
- Valid F-1 visa and passport
- · SEVIS I-901 Fee payment receipt
- Proof of finances for your first year of studies

US customs declaration form

You may have to complete the US Customs Declaration form during your flight to present to the immigration official when you enter the US. For more information about preparing to enter the US, visit studyinthestates.dhs.gov/students

Customs and immigration tips

An immigration officer may ask you some questions. Be prepared to answer:


- Why are you coming to the US?
- Where and what course are you studying?
- · Where will you live during your studies?
- · How are you going to fund your studies?

Your I-94 arrival/departure form is now a paperless document. However, if you receive a paper copy, do not lose it. It costs more than \$300 to replace a paper I-94.

Airport shuttle and greeting service

We offer INTO Mason airport pick-up and transfer service at Dulles International Airport (IAD) and Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport (DCA) during the weekend before Orientation. See below for specific days included in this service. If you submit your arrival details online at least 72 hours prior to your arrival, we can provide the pick-up and transfer service and send you a confirmation with more details. We will meet you at the airport and take you directly to your accommodation.

Housing and dining



Living on campus

All International Year One, Academic English + International Year One and Undergraduate Transfer Program students are required to live on campus during their program.

- Convenient on-campus locations close to classrooms, libraries, gyms and dining halls
- Live-in student staff to assist you 24 hours per day
- Securely locked exterior doors
- · Wireless high-speed internet
- Study lounges
- Laundry facilities
- Anytime dining plans so you can enter all George Mason dining halls as many times

per day as you wish

 Students who choose to live on campus will get to enjoy the benefits of the Global Center (bit.ly/INTOMasonACGC).

Your room includes

- Bed
- Desk and chair
- Closet space
- Linen package including sheets, pillow, pillowcases, blankets and towels
- If you live on campus, we will send you a housing confirmation email one month before the start date of your program with more details about move-in dates and procedures.

Graduate and Academic English students

If you plan to study only Academic English or a Graduate Pathway at INTO Mason, you will not be required to live on campus. However, you are welcome to apply to live on campus. We encourage you to apply early, as spaces fill up quickly. Academic English or Graduate Pathway students who wish to live on campus will live in the global center.

Off-campus housing information

If your program does not require you to live on campus, you can choose to live off campus. Consider the following when looking for an

off-campus option:

- · How do you plan to get to the university?
- How long will it take you to travel to the university?
- Will you have a roommate or do you want to live alone?

Orientation

As part of your INTO Mason program, you will attend a mandatory Orientation for one week. During this week, you will participate in several activities that will get you ready for classes as well as meet new friends.

At orientation you will:

- · Go on a campus tour
- · Get your Mason ID card
- Open your university email account
- Turn in required health vaccinations and documents
- Submit any transcripts and test scores
- · Pay any balances due
- · Take an English language placement test
- · Register for courses
- Learn about student visa regulations
- Learn about campus resources
- Attend fun activities and field trips and make #intofriends
- · Meet your academic advisor
- Find your classes on campus

What to bring to orientation

- · Original I-20
- · Acceptance letter
- Academic transcripts (except Academic English only students)
- · Immunization forms
- Passport

Course registration

Before you are registered for courses, you must complete the English language test, turn in all required documents and pay any remaining fees. Orientation leaders and INTO Mason staff will help you every step of the way.

Arriving late to orientation

It is important to arrive by the first day of Orientation. Since orientation sessions will be held in-person, you will have opportunities to make-up missed orientation sessions and information. Students who arrive after the first day of Orientation must have a late arrival letter to present at check-in. Late arrival letters are approved on a case-by-case basis and students who arrive late may be charged a \$250 fee. Students who arrive late without a late arrival letter may not be able to register for courses.

Math placement test

Students in the Engineering, Computing and Statistics International Year One and the Science International Year One program must take the test during their orientation to determine their math level and register for the correct math course.

Safety on campus

George Mason University is very safe and has its own full-service police department on campus. However, you should not engage in any activity that puts you in danger. Here are some tips on how to stay safe:

- Use well-lit and well-traveled paths at night.
- Always lock your doors and windows. If you drive a car, lock it at all times even while driving. Do not leave valuable items in your car.
- · Travel with a friend or group of people.
- Trust your instincts. If you do not feel comfortable in a situation, you can leave.
- If you are being harassed or experience any threats, let University Police know immediately. You can call the nonemergency number of the Police Department and request a police cadet to escort you safely on campus.

Money and banking

Cash

- US currency: US dollar (USD or \$) divided into 100 cents
- · Bills: \$100, \$50, \$20, \$10, \$5, \$1
- Coins: quarter (25 cents), dime (10 cents), nickel (5 cents), penny (1 cent)

You need easy access to at least \$500 or more to cover books, cell phone deposit and other living expenses when you arrive. You should not carry large amounts of cash with you, so you will need to open a bank account.

Transferring money

Before you leave your country, you need to know your government's regulations and your home bank's procedures for transferring money to the US. Plan to transfer enough money to cover your expenses for one semester, including books. Consider your living situation and lifestyle to plan ahead. Will you live off campus? Do you like to eat at restaurants? Do you need to buy clothes or more school supplies?

Credit/Debit cards

In the US, the most widely accepted bank and credit cards are Visa and MasterCard. Bank cards can either be debit which pulls funds from your bank account or credit, which you pay off at the end of each month. Apply for a credit card in your home country before you travel since it may be difficult for you to get one after you leave.

Bank accounts

During Orientation, you can meet with representatives from on-campus and off-campus banking services. To open an account, you will need two forms of photo identification (passport and Mason ID card), your US mailing address and money to deposit.

Transportation

Getting around campus Shuttles

George Mason provides various free shuttles that offer transportation from different locations on campus to the metro. The Global Center Metro shuttle provides direct service from the Global Center to the Vienna/ Fairfax-GMU metro stop. You can track the pick-up times and locations at www. Mason.ridesystems.net. Some shuttles run seven days a week, with limited times on the weekends.

Bike programs

George Mason is a bicycle-friendly university and has over 1,350 bike parking spots on campus including bike pumps and fix-it stations. To see a map of all the facilities and register your bike, visit bike.gmu.edu

Metro

The closest metro stop to the George Mason University Campus in Fairfax is the Vienna/Fairfax-GMU Metro station on the Orange Line. The Orange Line also goes to various locations in Washington, DC. Uber and Lvft

Uber and Lyft are smartphone applications that allow you to request a car that will pick you up based on your GPS location. When you download the app and sign up, enter your credit card information so you are automatically charged for the ride once you reach your destination. You do not need to pay or tip using cash—it is all included.

Getting around Arlington

The Arlington Campus is located at 3351 Fairfax Drive, Arlington, VA 22201. You will be just a 15-minute ride away from DC.

Public transportation

The Arlington Campus is conveniently located near many public transportation options. It is just steps away from the Virginia Sq-GMU metro station on both the Orange and Silver Lines, along with various Metrobus and ART Bus stops. You can find all your options at transportation.gmu.edu/Arlington

Do I need to attend the entire Orientation program?

Yes, Orientation is mandatory. You will complete many necessary tasks during Orientation that will need to be finished prior to the start of classes, including registering for classes. Refer to page 14 for a complete list of what you will do at Orientation. Any student who misses Orientation without prior approval will be charged a \$250 late arrival fee.

If I have any issues at the airport, who can I call?

INTO Mason has an emergency arrivals phone you can call or text 24 hours a day: +1 703 993 4501.

If I arrive before my residence hall move-in date, where should I stay?

You typically can move on campus two days before your Orientation start date. If you live off-campus, you should check your lease start date. If you will be arriving before these dates, refer to page 8 for a list of local hotels.

How much should I pack?

Most students bring only two suitcases and a carry-on bag. Additional seasonal clothing can easily be purchased in Fairfax, VA upon arrival. All bedding and towels will be provided upon arrival if you are living on campus.

What immunization shots do I need as an INTO Mason Student? Can I get my immunization shots done overseas?

A list of required immunizations is on page 6. You are encouraged to complete your immunizations before you arrive. Please bring copies of immunization proof in English with you to Orientation. If you do not have the needed immunizations upon arrival, you will receive them during Orientation week. All immunizations are free if you have the university health insurance plan.

What are the housing options?

International Year One, Academic English + International Year One and Undergraduate Transfer students will live in the Global Center (refer to campus map for location).


